



# One Piece Ski Mask

This pattern is simple for beginners and for those more advanced in crochet, it is a base for more fun additions, such as the cat ears shown. It takes less than one skein to make the mask and easy to adjust stitches for a variety of sizes.



**Materials:** One skein (4 oz) worsted wt yarn (any color)

Size G crochet hook      Marker      Tapestry Needle

**Gauge:** 4 sc = 1" ; 4 rows = 1"

*\* This pattern was written for a Med Lg—Lg (Ladies).  
To increase / decrease size of mask, simply adjust your  
stitches + or - in the crown of the mask (top of head).*

**Abbreviations:**      Sc - Single Crochet      SST—Slip Stitch      Inc.—Increase      Ch—Chain

**Begin** by Ch 2. Sc in 2nd ch sp from hook, then work 5 more sc in same sp. (6 sc in round). Ch 1, turn.

Row 1: 2 sc in next sp from hook, and 2 sc in ea of next 5 spaces around. Ch 1. Do not turn from here until indicated.

Row 2: \*1 sc in next sp from hook, 2 sc in next space, 1 sc in next space\*. Repeat from \* around. Ch 1.

Row 3-5: Repeat Row 2, twice more around, ch 1 at end of each row.

Row 6: \* Sc in next 3 spaces, 2 sc in next space, sc in next 3 spaces\*. Repeat from \* around. Ch 1.

Row 7: \*Sc in next 4 spaces, 2 sc in next space, sc in next 4 spaces\*. Repeat from \* around. Ch 1.

Row 8: \*Sc in next 5 spaces, 2 sc in next space, sc in next 5 spaces\*. Repeat from \* around. Ch 1.

Row 9: Sc in each space around. Ch 1.

Row 10: \*Sc in next 6 spaces, 2 sc in next space, sc in next 6 spaces\*. Repeat from \* around. Ch 1.

Row 10. Sc in each space around. Ch 1.

Row 11: \* Sc in next 7 spaces, 2 sc in next space, sc in next 7 spaces\*. Repeat from \* around. Ch 1.

Row 12: Sc in each space around. Ch 1.

Row 13: \*Sc in next 8 spaces, 2 sc in next space, sc in next 8 spaces\*. Repeat from \* around. Ch 1.

Row 14-16: Sc in each space around. Ch 1.

Row 17: Sc in next space from hook, then work a decrease of 1 sc over 2 sc evenly around (4 decreases total usually works)

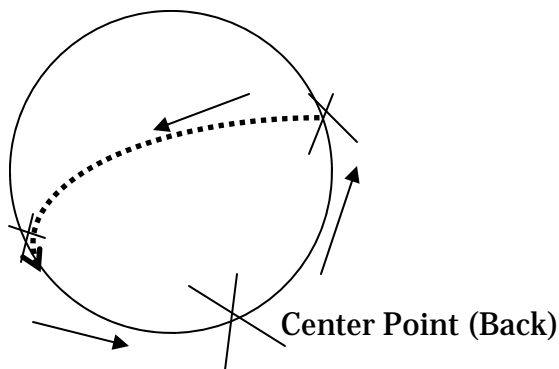
Row 18-20: Sc in each space around, ch 1 at end of each row. At end of #20, tie off and weave in loose end.

**Begin facial opening:**

Row 21: Using marker (safety pin or other), pin back center (best to use where rows begin and end). From center point, count 19 spaces left and right of point and mark both sides. Attach yarn to one marked side, work ch of 27. SST this chain into next mark on other side. **(See diagram)**

Row 22: Continuing with chain on hook, sc in each ch space, working toward center (marker), past marker and toward beginning of chain. Work sc in each ch space across 27 chains, and repeat to center marker again. Ch 1. *\* You are not filling in facial area, but rather working from the chain downward toward the neck. It will make sense once you begin a few rows.*

**Row 23—End** : Sc in each space around, assuring to ch 1 at center marker before continuing (to keep rows straight). Repeat this step until desired length of mask is achieved. Tie off loose end and weave in. Finish facial opening and bottom edge of mask by working in reverse Sc in each space around. Tie off and weave in loose end.
